
Dear Mr. Widman:

Since there is no case filed in the above action and the undersigned is entitled to retain the attorney of his choice, the only way this office can see that Mr. Dicks or a member of his firm can be admitted *pro haec vice* is to have your office issue a subpoena and I will move for an order to quash the subpoena before the Supreme Court of New Mexico under Rule 17-306.D and, while we are before the Court, obtain the right for these attorneys to defend my rights in the investigation.

If you agree that one is entitled to the attorney of his or her choice, then let's concentrate on getting that accomplished so that your office can move forward.

You should also note that if you issue a subpoena you must have on its face the reason or purpose for the investigation or hearing. Rule 17-306.C. You have refused to give me any specific sections of the Rules of Professional Conduct which are claimed to have been violated which you are investigating. Rule 17-307.C. These issues can also be raised at the Supreme Court.
