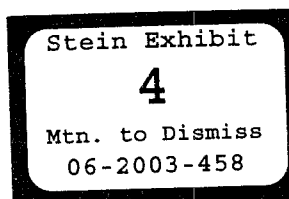
Re: Complaint filed by Barbara Boga-Rosh, Esq.

Dear Mr. Kay:

We contacted you by phone on March 4 regarding the above referenced case, in hopes that you could assist us in our investigation of Stuart Stein's alleged misconduct handling the Bogarosh estate. You stated that you needed to get a waiver of confidentiality from Ms. Boga-Rosh. We called again on March 19 and March 31 and spoke with your assistant who claimed that you were in the process of obtaining the waiver. We have not heard back from you.
